From the Chief Executive Officer

Dear Friends

Our collective experience of FY 21, July 1, 2020 through June, 30, 2021, is dominated by the escalation of the COVID-19 crisis and our efforts to mitigate the negative impact on the lives of all stakeholders. As the CDC, local health departments, and other experts updated recommendations and requirements to prevent the spread of COVID-19 and treat those who fell ill, CSS continuously updated day to day procedures and trainings. Individual daily schedules were adjusted to reduce interaction with others, staff schedules were changed to minimize the number of different people working in each location, employees were moved to remote work when possible, and virtual services were expanded across programs. Visitors to residences were not allowed, and visits to family homes were stopped.

Despite these efforts to reduce the risk of exposure to this disease, some individuals and CSS employees contracted the illness, with one individual requiring hospitalization. All CSS supported individuals and employees recovered from COVID-19, but many of us lost family members or friends this year. We also lost others to other illnesses, including our beloved Kris Gorman, employed with CSS since 1994. Kris was the first direct support staff hired by CSS as we began adult services, and her loss is grieved by all who knew her.

As we adjusted to the necessary changes and restrictions on where we could go and what we could do on a daily basis, we developed new routines and ways to interact with each other. During nice weather months, we developed outdoor activities which allowed for social distancing like structured fitness at Seneca Park and Riley's Lock. We found new places to walk and recreate in our neighborhoods, and hiked on trails in the county we had not explored before. Many were able to enjoy swimming in a family's private backyard pool, and others joined family members at the park to enjoy walks or picnics. Special events such as birthdays or holidays were celebrated virtually, and special foods and activities designed to recognize them were found. In many different ways,

we showed each other that we were still connected, still loved and appreciated, and we would continue to face the challenges together.

Individuals, staff, and family members all became more proficient with the use of Zoom and other online platforms. Virtual visits with family and friends, nursing and psychology services, as well as virtual activities improved and became routine. The camera systems and tablets in the residences became essential tools to deliver services and monitor the well being of people in multiple locations. The IT department managed systems and equipment in multiple sites to keep us connected and working.

During periods when PPE was hard to find, CSS received assistance to obtain needed supplies so that at a minimum direct support staff had a mask and cleaning supplies. As the year progressed, PPE became more available, and we acquired a large supply of different types of PPE for ongoing use. A team of staff trained in the use of N95 masks and face shields was put in place, and these dedicated employees supported individuals who tested positive for COVID-19. Some staff lived apart from their families in CSS isolation sites, in order to prevent the spread of the illness to their family members. Dr. Mike Greenberg provided hundreds of hours of medical advice and training, and other family members helped prepare supplies and made deliveries to residences. The CSS employees working at our deli, That's A Wrap, produced prepared meals and ordered food and household supplies for weekly pick ups by all residents.

State funding agencies including DDA and MSDE obtained approvals to develop certain flexibilities in the various waiver services impacting CSS supported children and adults. The autism waiver allowed individual support services to be used to help a child access virtual special education programming, and several children benefited from this service throughout the year. Special education, personal supports, and day habilitation were all allowed to be provided virtually, and CSS programs developed robust virtual offerings. Teachers and therapists met with students virtually for individual and group sessions. CSS expanded cooking and nutrition services by successfully implementing virtual strategies. Summer camp and days off from school were also provided virtually for some

children successfully. The flexibilities put in place by the state government for funding and service provision were effective and helpful throughout FY 21.

Advocacy at the state and federal level enabled people with disabilities in long term community services to be included in the early roll out of the vaccines. CSS partnered with CVS to hold three clinics at our main building and over 600 people received the two shots in February and March. By the end of FY 21, all individuals receiving residential services were fully vaccinated, the majority of children eligible and adults living in family homes were vaccinated, and about 75% of CSS employees were vaccinated for COVID-19.

While the pandemic continues to overshadow many aspects of our lives, we do have many positive successes this year to celebrate:

- We developed and implemented excellent educational and training regarding COVID-19 and how to live and work in a pandemic
- We developed virtual resources and skills across individuals, staff, and other stakeholders.
- We communicated within our community vital updates and information regarding the impact of the crisis and solutions.
- We attended carefully to information from state and local government to be included in grants, special programs, new policies, and flexibilities allowed due to the pandemic.
- We recognized our outstanding direct support professionals with the Windows on Our World ongoing program.
- We supported children and adults in highly individualized ways to access services adapting our building spaces to maximize safety.
- We upgraded ventilation, rearranged furniture, and developed procedures for the safe use of indoor spaces to meet individual needs.
- We won a small grant for a gardening program and began work growing food in a community garden plot.
- We expanded outdoor community activities in the spring and plan to continue to expand throughout the summer.
- 6 individuals joined adult day services and 56 adults received Personal


- Support Services in addition to Day Habilitation Services
- That's a Wrap provided meals and supplies to residences while continuing to provide employment to individuals with developmental disabilities
- CSS was approved for a Dietetic Intern Program by the Accreditation Council for Education in Nutrition and Dietetics
- Town Halls provided ongoing communication to our entire community
- CSS qualified for a PPP loan in the second round providing additional resources to offset costs of the pandemic

As I take the reins as the Chief Executive Officer July 1, 2021, I am committed to continue on the path we have chosen without interruption. As we begin FY 22, our team is strong. We continue to learn, adjust, and contribute our many talents and expertise so that we move forward together. Our goals include the resumption and expansion of in person services; hiring and training of staff to provide in person services across program areas; continuous review of COVID prevention procedures; and preparation for systems change as DDA continues its transformation to LTSS. I look forward to working closely with all stakeholders in FY22 and am confident in our ability to thrive regardless of the surprises and challenges we will find along the way.



Expenditures by Service




Expenditures by Major Category




Services Growth



Agency services growth throughout agency history. CSS began providing day and residential services in FY95 and the Marcia D Smith school opened in FY07. All services have expanded from program start through the end of FY21.

Spotlight on Services

Deon, an active 21 year old young man, lives with a housemate in Clarksburg. Deon entered residential services in 2011 and will be transitioning to adult residential services in 2021. Deon attends public school and he has been participating in after-school and special camps for children through CSS since he was six years old. Before the pandemic some of his afterschool activities included basketball, music, speech therapy, and attending classes in the community such as art and gymnastics. Living in Montgomery County allows Deon to be near his family and participate in activities with his friends several times a week. As part of his adult services Deon will be transitioning to an adult day habilitation schedule which will include swimming, baseball, fitness classes and community outings. Deon's team is focused on helping him learn both the vocational and communication skills that will help him succeed.




Performance

Strengthening Services

The monthly status system monitors program quality in critical areas on an ongoing basis. Every residential, educational and day service site is observed and evaluated by a program supervisor each month. The rating for each site is shared with all staff and areas needing improvement are reviewed and corrected. A score of 80% or better has been established as the agency goal which reflects a high programmatic quality and coordination of services, as well as overall compliance with licensing regulations. The agency's overall average on the monthly status for the first three quarters was 84%.

CSS developed and implemented an alternate monthly status tool that more specifically addresses program quality as it relates to health and safety management during the COVID-19 crisis and ultilized this alternate took throughout FY21. Specific areas addressed include: Safety Procedures, Cleaning/Disinfecting Procedures, Nutrition, Medication Administration, Exercise and Physical Activity Opportunities, Provision of Behavior Support Services, Adherence to Visitation Policy and Social Distancing requirements, and Communication/Coordination. A score of 100% was established as the agency goal for this newly adapted tool. The agency FY'21 overall average reliability score is a 97%.


Performance

The CSS Board of Directors conducts an annual satisfaction survey as part of the internal evaluation of quality. Individuals, family members and staff rate their level of satisfaction on specific areas of services with Residential, Adult Day, Children's Services, and the Marcia D Smith School. A 4 indicates that the respondent is highly satisfied and a 1 indicates a low level of satisfaction with that item. CSS services have maintained a consistent level of satisfaction, between satisfied and highly satisfied (3-4) each year since inception.

Christian, 28, lives with a housemate in Clarksburg. 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Spotlight on Services

Caleb, a 19 year old young man began with the Marcia D Smith School 2015 and in 2016 he entered residential educational services. Caleb has made a smooth transition into the program, where he receives non-public special education and related services in accordance with his individual education plan. Caleb prefers a structured schedule and before the COVID-19 pandemic was in the classroom and enjoyed group activities. In the last two years his team has adapted to ensure that he has predictability while providing a framework allowing Caleb to pursue his goals.

Together, Caleb and his team utilize various educational technologies in ways that improve learning and promote connectivity. Therapeutic services are integrated throughout his day and include psychological, psychiatric, and speech and language



therapy. With staff support, Caleb is active and participates in many different activities around his community. Caleb has many virtual classes and meets with his teachers and engages with his classmates. In addition he has been able to resume some of his favorite activities such as visiting with his family and swimming at the centers in the community.
